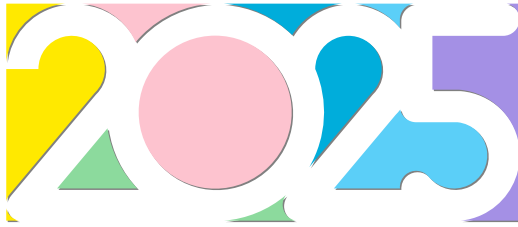

My name is Lucien Houndoevou. Growing up in a predominantly Muslim community in Porto-Novo, Benin Republic, I faced uncertainty and sorrow, including losing my mother at nine. But everything changed when I encountered the missionaries from Agape House New Testament Church. Their evangelistic preaching sparked a deep question in me and my friends: "Can Jesus protect us from evil attacks?" The answer was a resounding yes.

On February 2, 2025, I surrendered my life to Jesus Christ along with the others. This marked the beginning of an incredible journey. I started attending Thursday Agape House Fellowship Bible studies and even served as a French-to-Gou language interpreter. My desire to serve God and learn more about Him motivated me to get involved.

As I learn to play the piano and grow in God's word, my faith is getting stronger. The missionary pastors' encouragement and teachings have been a blessing. 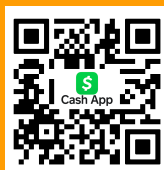
Resurrection Power!
