REACHING MUSLIMS FOR CHRIST

In West Africa, the call to share the Gospel with our Muslim neighbors is both urgent and full of hope. At Agape Churches, we see every day how the love of Jesus transforms lives—breaking chains of fear, sickness, and spiritual bondage. This edition of Agape Today highlights powerful testimonies of Muslims who have found new life in Christ, along with a glimpse into the challenging yet ripe mission field where we serve.

TRANSFORMATIONS THROUGH FAITH

At the Agape Church in Bo, Sierra Leone, we rejoice in stories like these. Auntie Kadie Kallon turned to Jesus after years of hardship. Sister Isata Turay experienced healing from a terminal illness after encountering Christ at a revival, and her husband, Mr. John Turay, later followed Jesus despite opposition from his family. Brother Suma, once bound by religious routine, now radiates joy and serves faithfully in youth ministry.

Auntie Kadie Kallon

After a life of hardship, I found in Jesus the only way forward. Now, despite pressure, I stand firm as a changed and active member of His church.

When medicine failed, my encounter with Jesus brought healing. My husband and I now follow Him together, growing in faith and testimony.

Witnessing the transformation in my wife led me to follow Christ alongside her. Though cut off by family, I remain a vibrant and steadfast believer.

These stories remind us that the Gospel is alive and at work, even within Muslim communities.

Background: Kadie was a devoted Muslim. She was married to a very fanatical Muslim man, now deceased. During her marriage, her husband often consulted spiritualists because of severe family hardships. After the death of her husband, her life became increasingly difficult.

The Turning Point: In February, she encountered Christ during a home cell meeting at Sister Margaret's house, who is a member of the Agape Church. After the teaching and prayers, she boldly stood up and shared that since the death of her husband, her life had gone from bad to worse. However, based on what she heard that day, she believed in her heart that Jesus Christ was the only way left for her. She testified that through the help of the church and the work of God, great changes have begun to take place in her life and in the lives of her children.

Forward in Faith: She is now a committed follower of Jesus Christ. Despite pressure from family members to abandon her faith, she has remained steadfast and is currently an active and faithful member of the church.



KADIE



JOHN

Background: John was a Muslim who had stopped actively worshipping God. He is the husband of Sister Isata Turay.

The Turning Point: After his wife was delivered from the illness, which had cost the family a great deal financially and emotionally, she shared her experience with him. At first, he doubted her testimony because of his Muslim background. However, over time, he began to notice a tremendous change in his wife's life.

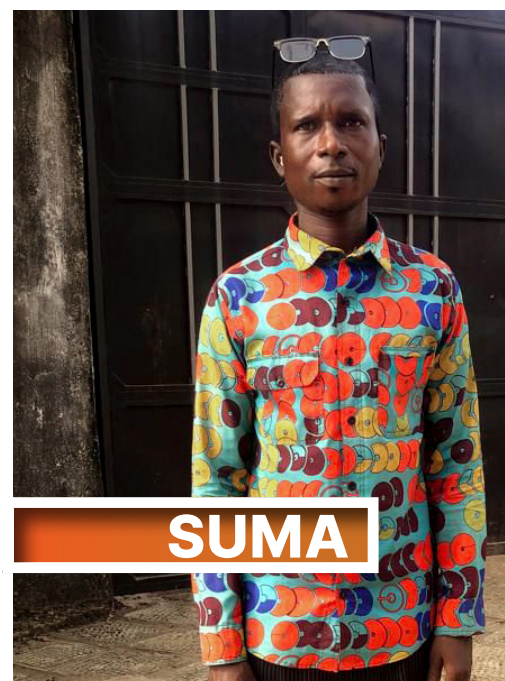
Although he struggled with the question of whether a Muslim could attend church, through his wife's encouragement, he decided to follow Christ together with his children, regardless of opposition from his family.

Forward in Faith: Despite being cut off by his family, John remains firm in his faith. He is now a vibrant, growing, and active member of the church, standing strong in his decision to follow Jesus Christ.

Background: Brother Suma was a devoted Muslim, faithful in his daily prayers. However, he had never experienced the presence of God. He lived in fear and religious routine, constantly worried about the afterlife.

The Turning Point: After an encounter with the Agape evangelism team, he was invited to a Friday Divine Encounter service. During the prayers, he felt an overwhelming sense of peace and love that he had never experienced before. He was deeply moved by the message of unconditional love shown to him from his very first visit.

Forward in Faith: Since that day, Brother Suma has been attending Sunday services and weekly church programs. He is now a joyful and active member of the church and is involved in the youth ministry, helping other young people who are searching for meaning and purpose in life.



SUMA

Background: Sister Isata Turay was born and raised in Bo in a deeply religious Muslim family. Before her conversion, she was a devoted practitioner of Islam.

The Turning Point: Sister Isata had been suffering from a terminal illness. When the sickness began, she became even more devoted to her five daily prayers, believing Allah would heal her. When there was no improvement, she also sought help from herbalists, but nothing worked.

In June, Sister Isata was invited by a woman from Agape House to Agape Church's end-of-month revival. Because of family pressure and fear of public opinion, she did not attend the first night. After encouragement and the assurance that Jesus could heal her, she attended the second night.

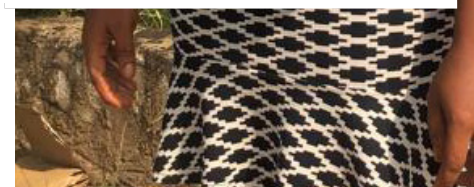
During the service, she encountered Jesus powerfully and felt a change in her body. She returned for the final night, and there was a complete turnaround in her life. Coming from a Muslim household, giving a public testimony was difficult, and fear and shame made her unsure whether she should continue attending church.

Later, she had a dream in which someone like Jesus told her to return to church and testify about what God had done, or a worse sickness would come. After discussing the dream with her husband and with Auntie Amie, she returned to church in August 2025. With courage, she testified publicly, gave her life to Christ, and brought her husband with her.

Forward in Faith: Today, Sister Isata and her husband are committed members of the church. She attends Wednesday Life Night teachings and home cell groups and has begun reading the Bible and praying on her own, showing clear spiritual growth.

THE REALITY OF PERSECUTION

While these testimonies are deeply personal, they reflect a much larger and more dangerous reality across West Africa. Our mission takes place in a region where following Christ often comes at a high cost. West Africa experiences the world's highest documented levels of violence against Christians by Muslims. Nigeria alone accounts for approximately 90% of Christians killed for their faith worldwide. Our pastors in high-risk areas such as Makurdi and Abuja stand on the front lines every day, shepherding their flocks amid threats of violence, church attacks, and targeted killings. Their calling demands extraordinary courage and a daily dependence on God's protection.

A Door of Opportunity: Reaching the Fulani

One of the most strategic opportunities before us is ministry among the Fulani people—a vast, largely nomadic group spread across West Africa. The Fulani are approximately 99% Muslim, and radical elements within some Fulani communities have been involved in violence against Christians. Yet God's grace reaches even the hardest hearts. By His mercy, AGM has been given an open door for courageous, culturally sensitive outreach among the Fulani.

Missionaries like Pastor Saed, a Fulani tribesman in Ghana, are leading entire communities to Christ through Fula-language films and pastoral care. His work is a powerful reminder that even in the most sensitive settings, the Gospel brings transformation from within.

Together, we can walk through these open doors of opportunity and see more Muslims come to know the joy and hope found in Jesus.
